Meeting Our Community Where They Are

Pets are more than just animals; they're cherished members of our families. Tragically, the scarcity of affordable pet-friendly housing and the increase in pet care costs are breaking families apart—not to mention filling shelters already at maximum capacity. That is why Seattle Humane continues to advocate for pet-friendly housing, offer financial assistance to pets in need and build out our veterinary medicine capabilities to serve shelter animals and community pets alike.

By helping people care for their pets, these services are keeping families together and proving an effective way to divert pets from shelters entirely. Services include Seattle Humane's Pet Food Bank, Community Clinic and a temporary foster care program (SPOT) designed to aid pet owners in crisis—serving many facing housing insecurity, unexpected hospitalization or those fleeing domestic violence.

We recently hosted a pet resource pop-up with nonprofit Alimentando al Pueblo in Burien, Washington during their regularly scheduled food bank hours. Community members received information in English and Spanish about our affordable veterinary services and support programs. We are proud to partner with grassroots organizations serving communities impacted by systemic, generational disadvantages.

Meeting our community where they are ensures love stays where it belongs.

As we forge ahead, I'm excited to share our progress and the bright future for Seattle Humane and the pets we serve. **Your steadfast** partnership makes this possible. Thank you for your continuous and generous support!
